Collegiate Volunteer Guide At-A-Glance

Conference Location

This year Detroit will be the host city for the **40th Annual Conference and Exposition presented by NMBAA®**. The hub for most of our programming and events will take place at the **Cobo Center at 1 Washington Blvd, Detroit, MI 48226. Volunteer Operations will also be housed at this location.** Conference dates are Tuesday, September 25, 2018 - Saturday, September 29, 2018. However, volunteer opportunities/assignments may start as early as Sunday, September 23, 2018.

Dress Attire

Students are requested to wear business attire at conference at all times. If you don't have a business suit, you must wear dark dress slacks and dress shirt with tie for males. For women, you should wear dark dress slacks, skirt and blouse or business dress. Shoes should be dark color dress shoes that are comfortable. Keep in mind Dress for Success is an affordable way to start to build your business attire.

Student Volunteer Orientation

This will be a pre-conference, to include an opportunity to represent your school by getting the most student volunteers to come out in school attire. You will receive a brief orientation covering your volunteer role, documenting your time & rewards/perks. We will be registering volunteers onsite at this event!

*This information will be reviewed again on the day of your first volunteer assignment.

Arrival to Conference

- Please report to the volunteer office by 45 minutes before the start of your assignment.
- Transportation once onsite will be provided if you are required to volunteer at opportunities not held at the convention center.
- Transportation is not provided to the Conference.

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Student Volunteer Sign-in and Sign Out

- Report to Volunteer Office.
- Make the office staff aware of the school you are representing.
- Sign-in to the Volgistics Volunteer System.
- You must have a valid pin number to use the Volgistics System (use this link to check your pin number: <https://www.volgistics.com/ex/portal.dll?FROM=31527>)

Student Volunteer Assignments

- Self-scheduling: You are given the option to self-schedule for volunteer assignments that best fit your school and work schedule. Self-scheduling will open Friday, July 30, 2018.

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The National Black MBA Association® (NMBBAA®) is dedicated to the enhancement and development of educational and economic empowerment for minorities. Participation in the organizations' programs and events are subject to the observance of the organizations' rules and procedures. **The activities outlined below are strictly prohibited.** Any volunteer or participant who violates this Code is subject to discipline, up to and including removal from the program or event and/or any future involvement.

The NMBBAA® Code of Ethics covers a wide range of business practices and procedures. It does not cover every circumstance that may arise, but it sets out basic principles to guide all volunteers of the organization. All of our volunteers must conduct themselves according to the guiding principles of the Code of Ethics and seek to avoid even the appearance of improper behavior. The code should be thoroughly reviewed, signed, and followed by all volunteers of the organization.

This code adheres to all local, state and federal laws. If a common practice conflicts with this Code, it is the responsibility to report all violations immediately to the Executive Leadership of both the NMBBAA®. Volunteers are responsible for understanding the requirements that apply to their volunteer assignments or duty as a representative of the NMBBAA®.

Those who violate the standards in this Code will be subject to progressive disciplinary action, up to and including possible termination of volunteer status. Furthermore, violations of the Code of Ethics may also be violations of the law and may result in civic or criminal penalties.

VOLUNTEER CODE OF ETHICS

- Must carry out all duties and activities in a manner consistent with maintaining the good reputation of the NMBBAA® and its ability to pursue our mission.
- When dealing with clients, participants, staff members, or volunteers, will hold themselves free of any interest, influence or relationship regarding any professional activity that could impair professional judgment or objectivity.
- Abusive language towards a staff member, volunteer or another participant is strictly prohibited and may result in the removal from the volunteer team.
- Possession or use of illegal drugs or the abuse of alcohol as deemed by the standards of intoxication on NMBBAA® property or events or reporting to the program or event while under the influence of drugs or alcohol may result in immediate removal from the volunteer team.
- Bringing onto NMBBAA® property or event site, dangerous or unauthorized materials such as explosives, firearms, weapons or other similar items will result in the immediate removal from the volunteer team and may result in police involvement.

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VOLUNTEER CODE OF ETHICS...CONT'D

- Discourtesy or rudeness to a fellow participant, staff member or volunteer may result in the immediate removal from the volunteer team.
- Verbal, physical or visual harassment of another participant, staff member or volunteer will result in the immediate removal from the volunteer team and may result in police involvement.
- Actual or threatened violence toward any individual or group will result in the immediate removal from the volunteer team and may result in police involvement.
- Ethics endangering the life, safety, health or well-being of others will result in the immediate removal from the volunteer team and may result in police involvement.
- Failure to follow any organization policy or procedure may result in the immediate removal from the volunteer team.
- Bullying or taking unfair advantage of any participant may result in the immediate removal from the volunteer team.
- Failing to cooperate with a supervisor or project leader may result in the immediate removal from the volunteer team.
- Removal or distribution of NMBAA® goods and/or property without authorization from NHQ may result in removal from the volunteer team.
- Must abide by the principles laid out in the Code of Ethics for the organization, and comply by all by-laws, regulations, resolutions, and rules of professional ethics of the organization.
